"We hope that our community will feel comfortable in asking questions, bringing concerns, or simply getting to know our deputies," said Sheriff Gerald Couch. "These types of interactions are the very foundation of strong community partnerships."

Coffee with a Cop is a national initiative supported by The United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services. Similar events are being held across the country, as local police departments, sheriff's offices, and state police forces strive to make lasting connections with the communities they serve.

The program aims to advance the practice of community policing through improving relationships between law enforcement and community members "one cup of coffee at a time".
