Sheriff Announces Lieutenant Promotions In The Jail Division

On Friday, April 12, 2013 Sheriff Gerald Couch announced the three most recent Officers to assume leadership positions within the Hall County Jail.

From within the Hall County Sheriff's Office, Lieutenant David Sullivan joined the ranks as a Deputy in the Uniform Patrol Division in 1986. From there, he moved into the Traffic Enforcement Unit. Sullivan then made his way through the ranks of Corporal to Sergeant, eventually becoming an active member of the S.W.A.T. Team.

Lieutenant Johnny Gomez joins us from the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office. He brings a wealth of military experience to his new post at the Hall County Jail. In addition to serving in the U.S. Army Special Forces, Gomez began his Law Enforcement career in 1993. He served at Riverside Military Academy (from 1993–1995), Cumming Police Department (1995-1997) and at the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office (from 1997-2013). While in Forsyth County, Lieutenant Gomez previously held posts as Lieutenant in the Uniform Patrol Division, Lieutenant in the Special Operations Division and a Captain's position within the Jail.

Lieutenant Lisa Selke also embarked upon her Law Enforcement career at the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office, in 1995. Her previous rank and positions include that of a Detention Officer, Patrol Officer, employee of the Solicitor's Office, Code Enforcement, Sergeant and Lieutenant in the Court Administration.
