

## **Dog Shot by Arrow Adopted From the Hall County Animal Shelter**

A Great Pyrenees badly wounded by an arrow has been nursed back to health and is now being adopted by the Good Samaritan who saved her life.

According to officials with the Hall County Animal Shelter, Will Peters spotted the big white dog near the intersection of Athens Highway and Lenox Road on Feb. 1 and noticed she was in desperate need of medical care.

He brought her to the Hall County Animal Shelter, where Dr. Meghan Seabolt discovered she had been pierced with an arrow. Dr. Seabolt was able to perform surgery on the dog, who has been named Florence, and was successful in removing the arrow from her back.



Now in recovery, Florence is also ready to go home with her new owner, who happens to be Mr. Peters, the Good Samaritan who originally brought her to the shelter.

Hall County Animal Control has posted signs in the area where the dog was found, asking residents who may have information about how Florence was injured to come forward. Their investigation into the incident is ongoing.
