1. Election: GENERAL ELECTION
2. Date Election called: SET BY LAW
3. Election to be: November 8, 2016
4. Time polls are open: 7am to 7pm
5. Closing date for registration for this election: CLOSE OF BUSINESS OCTOBER 11, 2016
6. Candidate(s), Issue(s) to be voted on: US PRESIDENT & VICE PRESIDENT; US SENATOR & CONGRESSMAN; STATE SENATORS, REPRESENTATIVE & PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSIONERS; COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION (POSTS 3&4), COMMISSIONERS (POST 2, 4 & CHAIRMAN), CLERK OF SUPERIOR COURT, SHERIFF, TAX COMMISSIONER, CORONER, SURVEYOR, CHIEF MAGISTRATE, PROBATE JUDGE & MAGISTRATE JUDGE; CITY OF LULA LIQUOR BY THE DRINK; AMENDMENTS AND REFERENDUMS.
7. Active registered voters involved: 82,095 ACTIVE VOTERS; 104,563 ELIGIBLE (As of August 3, 2016)
8. Area of County or City involved in this election: COUNTY-WIDE
9. Number of precincts involved in the election: 31
10. Number of election workers for this election: APPROXIMATELY 300
11. Projected voter turn-out based on active voters: 64% (52,541 VOTERS)
12. The first Unofficial Precinct Returns are usually available at approximately 8:30pm on Election Night , with updates and the Final Unofficial Returns at approximately 11pm. 13. INFORMATION FOR VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT: Eligible voters have (2) ways to cast ballots prior to Election Day: Absentee by Mail and Advance (Early) Voting

## ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL

Eligible voters desiring to vote by mail may do so WITHOUT PROVIDING A REASON OR IDENTIFICATION. However, voters who registered for the first time in Georgia by mail and did not provide identification, will be required to provide at the time of voting, one of the six acceptable forms of PHOTO ID listed on page 3 or a copy of current utility bill, blank statement, government check, paycheck or other governmental document that shows the name and address of the voter. **Those voters not having the proper form of identification will be offered a Provisional Ballot.**

ABSENTEE BALLOTS ARE AVAILABLE 45 DAYS PRIOR TO A FEDERAL ELECTION.  
BALLOTS WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR MAIL ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2016

Voters may request an Absentee Ballot by mail beginning 180 days prior to any election. However, the last day an Absentee Ballot can be mailed is Friday, November 4, 2016.

### **WHAT TO INCLUDE IN THE BY-MAIL ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST**

Voters may mail or fax a written request for an Absentee Ballot. The written request should include:

- Name and address as registered to vote
- Date of birth
- Election name and date (i.e. General Election – November 8, 2016 )
- Address where ballot is to be mailed
- Daytime contact or phone number
- Voter's written signature

### **WHERE TO SEND THE ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUEST**

## **WHEN & WHERE VOTE BY-MAIL ABSENTEE BALLOT MUST BE RETURNED**

## **ACCEPTABLE PHOTO IDENTIFICATION FOR VOTING**

Acceptable forms of **Photo Identification** are:

1. A Georgia Driver's License (even if expired or suspended);
2. Valid State or Federal Government photo ID;
3. Valid US Passport with photo;
4. Valid Government Employee photo ID (City, County, State or US Government)
5. Valid US Military photo ID
6. Tribal photo ID

**A voter who does not have any of the above photo IDs may obtain a Voter Identification Card at NO COST upon providing that they are a Georgia voter, from the Hall County Board of Elections and Registrars Office or the Department of Driver Services.**

14. OBSERVATION OF COUNT: On Election Night, the public may observe the tabulation of votes at 2875 Browns Bridge Road; Phone: (770) 531-6945

Note: All results on Election Night are UNOFFICIAL and include Absentee Ballots, but do not include Provisional Ballots. Absentee Ballots are counted on Election Day. Provisional Ballots are counted no later than 5:00pm on the Friday after the Election. Unofficial Vote Totals are subject to change during the reconciliation process.

#### 15. DISSEMINATION AND VIEW OF ELECTION RESULTS

BY PHONE: Election results on Election Night can be obtained by phone (770) 531-6945 until 11pm. Due to the volume of calls on Election Night, election results provided by phone are limited to a maximum of 3 races or questions per caller.

IN PERSON: On Election Night, the public may observe the tabulation of votes at the Elections Office. Election results will be displayed until all votes are tallied with the exception of Provisional Votes which are tabulated the Friday after the Election.

15. COPIES OF ELECTION SUMMARIES AND STATEMENT OF VOTES CAST: An Unofficial Summary of Election Results will be released throughout the count process in Hall County Board of Elections Office (with exception to Provisional Ballots). Unofficial Precinct Returns Statement of Votes Cast (SOVC) will be available by 10am the day after the election at the same location and on our website at <http://elections.hallcounty.org>

## VOTER'S CHECKLIST – Things to Do before Election Day

1. Confirm you are registered to vote several weeks before the date of the election. Update your registration information, such as address and name. How? Contact the Elections Office at 770-531-6945 or inquire at <https://www.mvp.sos.ga.gov/MVP/mvp.do>.
2. Know how and when to apply for an Absentee Ballot if you are unable to vote in person at your polling place on Election Day or during the Advance Voting period.
3. Know the voter identification requirements before you attempt to vote.
4. Know which polling place you are assigned to and how to get there.
5. Familiarize yourself with the voting device used. Learn how the device is accessible to voters with disabilities.
6. Learn who can assist in voting and who can receive assistance.
7. Know what time the polls open and close; (7am until 7pm)
8. Obtain a Sample Ballot from the Elections Office to become acquainted with candidates and issues on the ballot. Access a sample ballot at: <http://www.hallcounty.org/249/Elections>
