Inspection Comments

Upon arrival, I met with Trey and Angie. Angie escorted me through the facility and outdoor grounds. Angie was present during the entire inspection of the shelter premises. . The exterior grounds are clean and free of debris. All fencing and kennels appear to be structurally sound with the exception of one outdoor kennel. That one kennel has a hole in the door. It is empty (contains no animal). Angie explained that it has been deemed unusable until the hole is repaired. The outdoor kennels are clean; all dogs have access to fresh water. The outdoor kennels are covered to provide shade and shelter. There is an igloo doghouse in each outdoor kennel also. There is a security fence around the two outdoor kennel areas.

There is a horse on premise as well. It has been provided a paddock with access to a stall. The horse has access to fresh water, hay and feed. I spoke with ACO Kevin about the horse. He explained that the horse was picked up running "at large." Animal Control has found and made contact with the owner who will pick it up this weekend.

There are goats in a back paddock as well. The goats also have access to a stall for shelter and shade. There is a short to medium grass cover in the paddock. The goats have access to fresh feed and water.

I observed no signs or illness, injury or disease in any of the animals in the outdoor areas.

Inside the shelter, I found all rooms either clean or in the process of being cleaned. All dogs and cats have access water with the exception of one. It appeared the dog had turned over the water bucket sometime during the morning. I pointed this out to Angie. She had the kennel worker fill the bowl immediately. All kennels and cages appear structurally sound. The shelter is equipped with a fire sprinkler system. There are also charged fire extinguishers on premise.

I did not observe any housekeeping or drainage violations. The Lighting, ventilation, and temperatures are adequate. The floors and surfaces are impervious to moisture. I observed no violations of classification & separation or waste disposal.

There are two cats being isolated near the intake are due to URI. Although isolated in their own individual kennels, the kennels are part of a bank of kennels. There are other cats in the other kennels of the bank. The two URI cats are too close to other healthy cats. I had Angie relocate these two cats to a more isolated area completely away from any healthy cats. This was done immediately.

All animals are fed at specific times throughout the day. The horse and goats have access to fresh hay and/or grass 24/7.

It appears all animals on premise are receiving humane care.

Incoming/outgoing records are kept electronically in Petpoint. The records are up to date and meet GDA recordkeeping requirements. Hall County Animal Shelter has 4 active fosters. The Shelter is still using an older Foster Agreement form. I explained this to Trey and have emailed him the electronic "Animal Shelter" folder with the newest forms.

Hall County Animal Shelter has a current, active GDA Animal Shelter license; expiration 8/31/19.

All requirements passed. No violations issued.

I did take pictures during the inspection.
